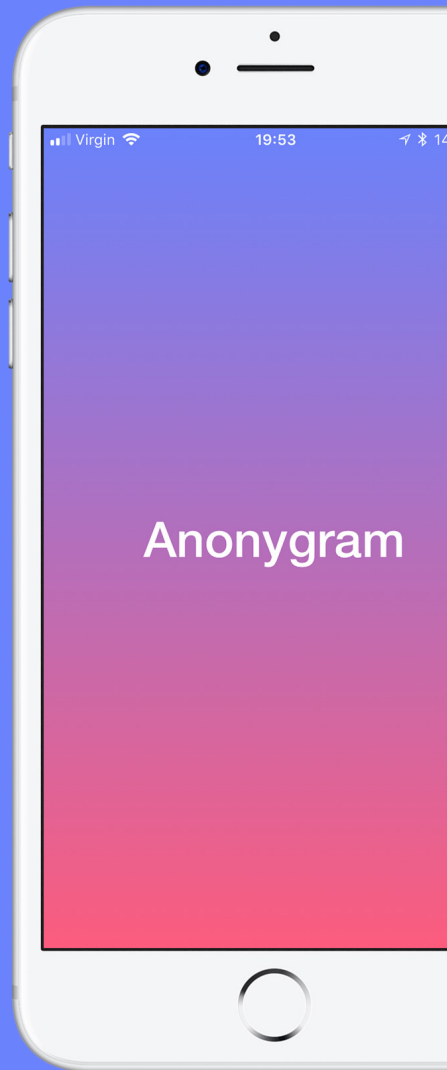

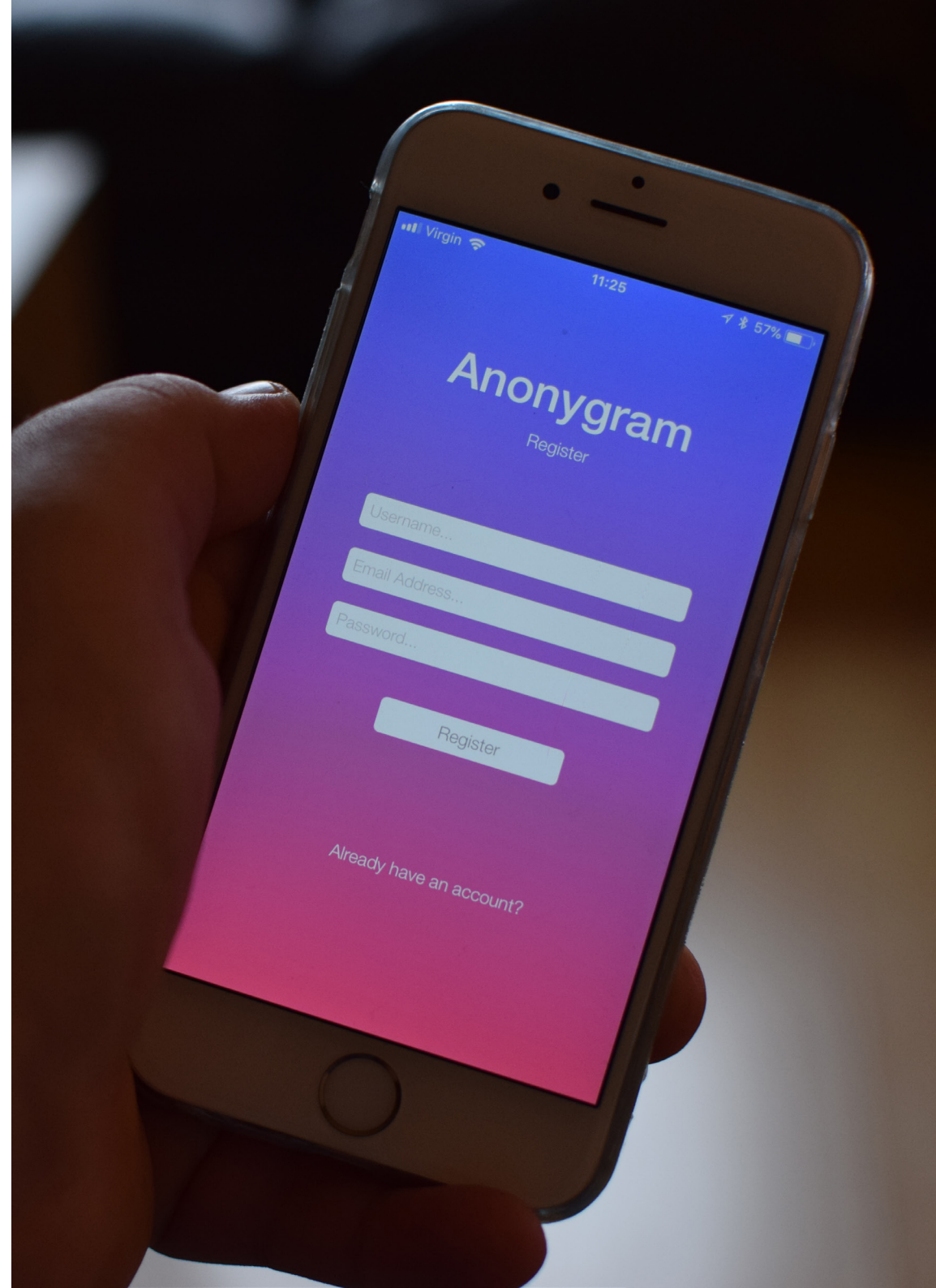

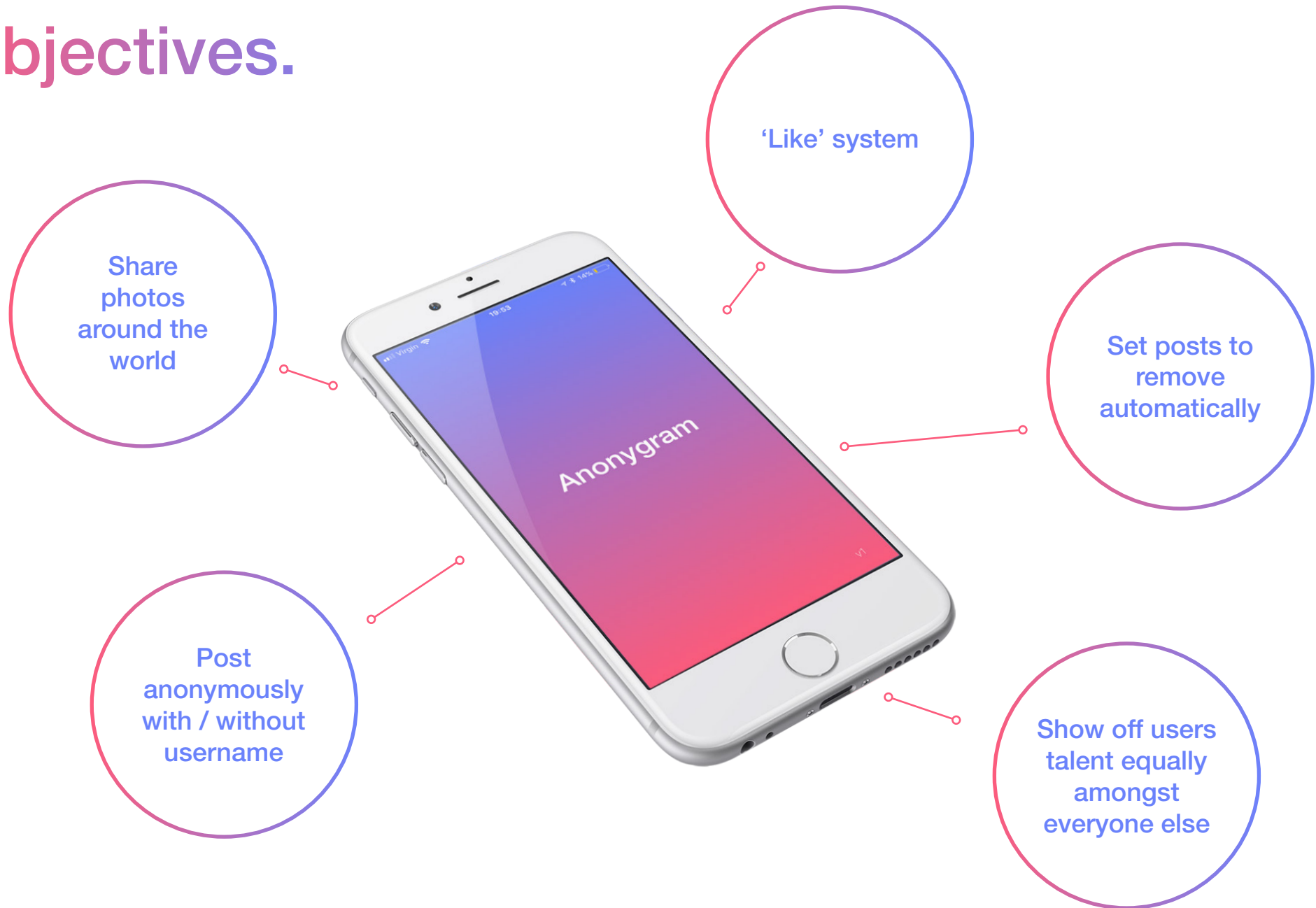

# The aim.

Anonygram will allow users from across the globe the chance to post images anonymously. Images can be regularly posted of areas and locations around the world, with the option to either show their usernames or simply remain 'Anonymous'. As the posts will be anonymous, even with a username, it is important to factor in a flagging system for inappropriate and irrelevant content within Anonygram. The app can be used anywhere with an internet connection, allowing users to share photos whenever and wherever they want to. With other image sharing platforms such as Instagram, users are rated by 'followers' and who they are as people. Celebrities and other users alike gain much more attention than regular users which creates an unfair platform for amateur photographers. The ultimate aim for this application is to make everyone equal, nobody knows who posted the image, meaning that nobody can be biased giving you a chance to prove your raw talent in photography.

# Competitor analysis 1: Whisper



## About Whisper

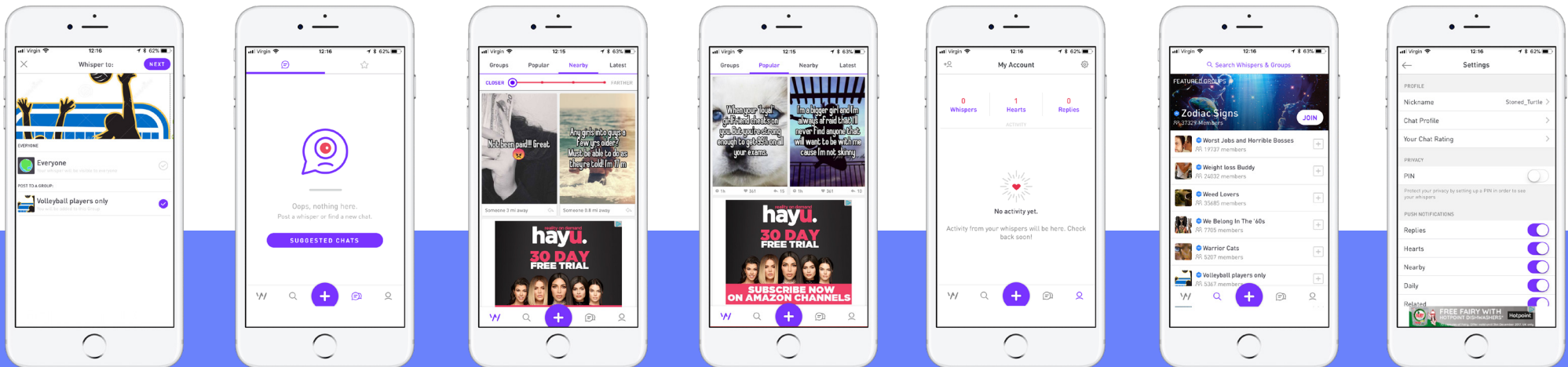
Whisper is an application available on both iOS and android, where users are able to share their thoughts and feelings anonymously using pre-set images within their database. Whisper is leading a movement that believes that happiness starts with being your real self. Whisper is a competitor due to its anonymity, although it doesn't allow the creative freedom of uploading your own photos.

## Advantages

- Users can choose to post to everyone or their own 'groups' which determines who see's their content.
- Users can chat between one another using the built in chat function.
- Posting is easy and images are provided as part of the service.
- Users can search for 'whispers' or groups.

## Disadvantages

- Because of groups and chats, I don't feel like it's completely anonymous due it being more personal.
- Due to anonymity people say things they usually wouldn't in real life (false confidence).
- Ads make the app look tacky and disrupt engagement
- Used for inappropriate content



# Competitor analysis 2: Shush



## About Shush

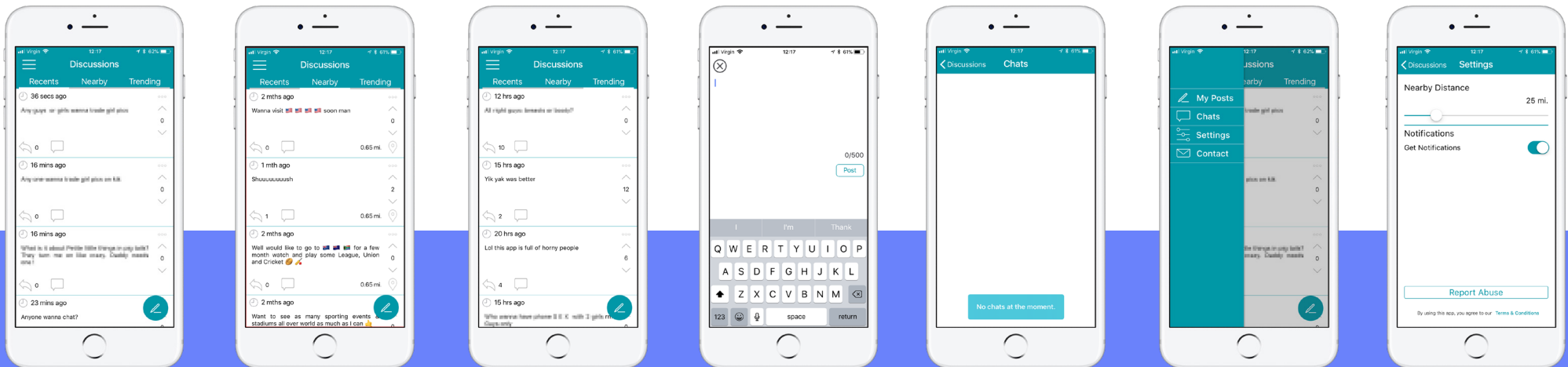
Marketed as an open and safe space or community where user's can share their ideologies, opinions, thoughts, beliefs or trade advice without revealing their identities. Their primary goal is to create a social experience where users can freely express themselves and speak about anything and not be judged for it.

## Advantages

- Allows user's to express their feelings, thoughts and other topics without being judged.
- Allows users to upvote and downvote content.
- Allows users to respond and comment to each post
- Does't require login to use the app

## Disadvantages

- Because of it's anonymity, people are using this application in means that they shouldn't be.
- The applications design is quite basic and doesn't really look appealing.
- The overall idea of the application is formed from previous successful applications meaning it has been replicated many times and is similar to many other available apps.





# Competitor analysis 3: Haip



## About Haip

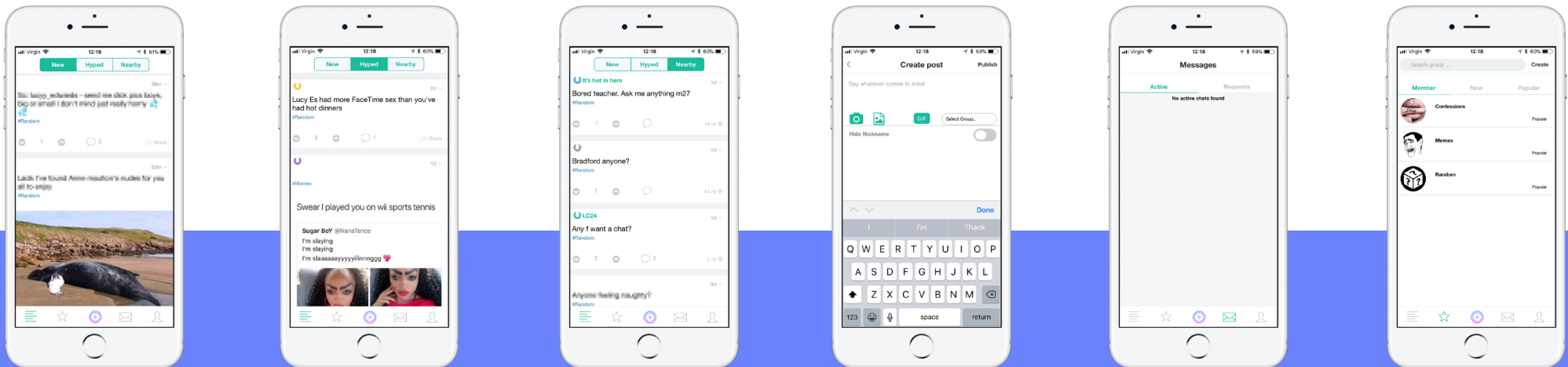
You are able to become part of a community. With the possibility to use the application without creating an account at all, you are fully able to have an anonymous experience as you would expect. You are able to share whatever is on your mind without being judged by friends or family with the people around you.

## Advantages

- No account needed to use the app, completely anonymous.
- Confess anonymously.
- Managed by it's users using the voting system, similar to the successful anonymous app Yik-Yak.
- Users can post images or text.
- Can show or hide username easily on each post.

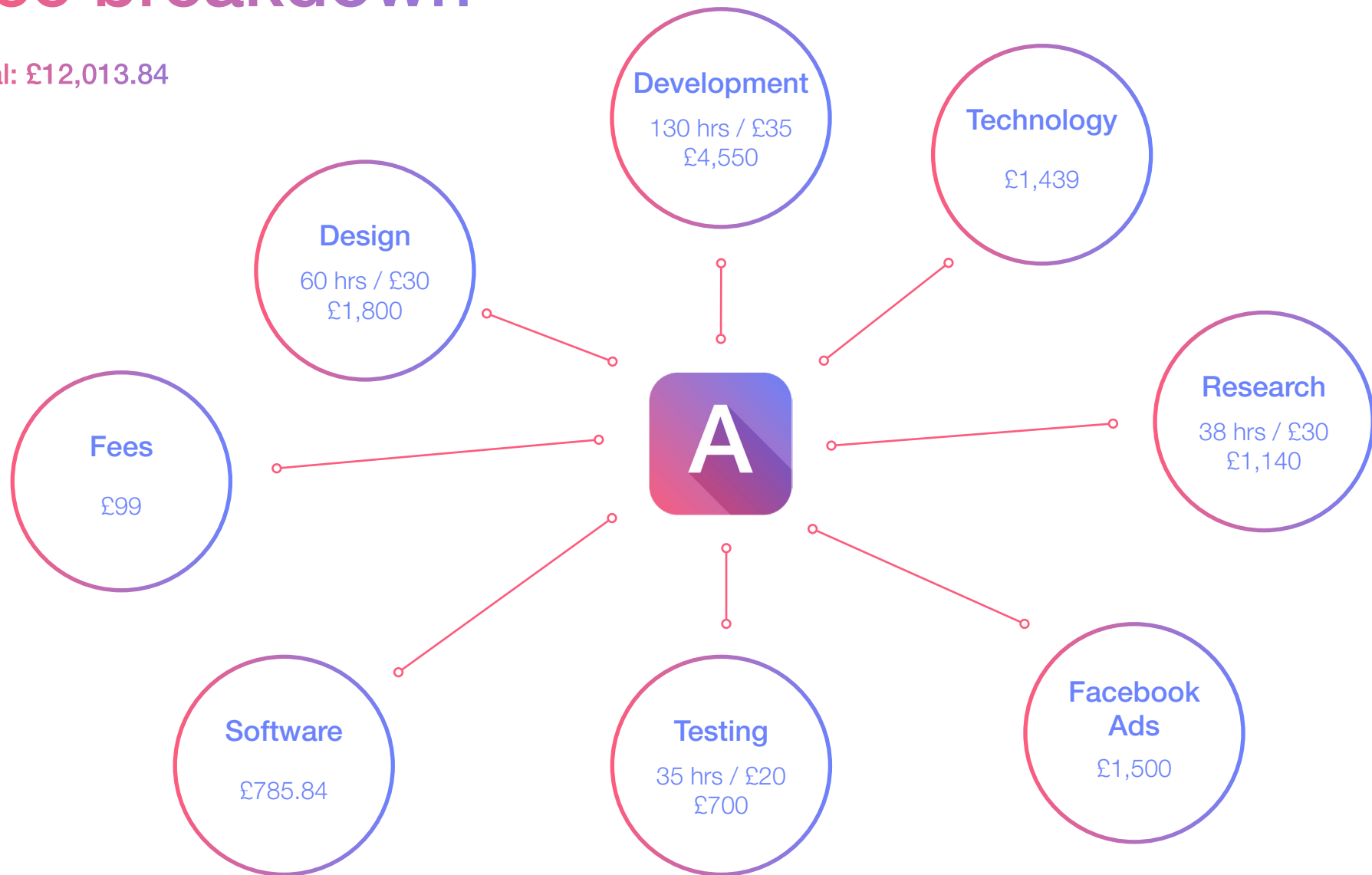
## Disadvantages

- User's can post anonymously.
- Users can chat between one another using the built in chat function.
- Again, the app is vulnerable to irrelevant content which can be inappropriate and hard to regulate due to users being anonymous.

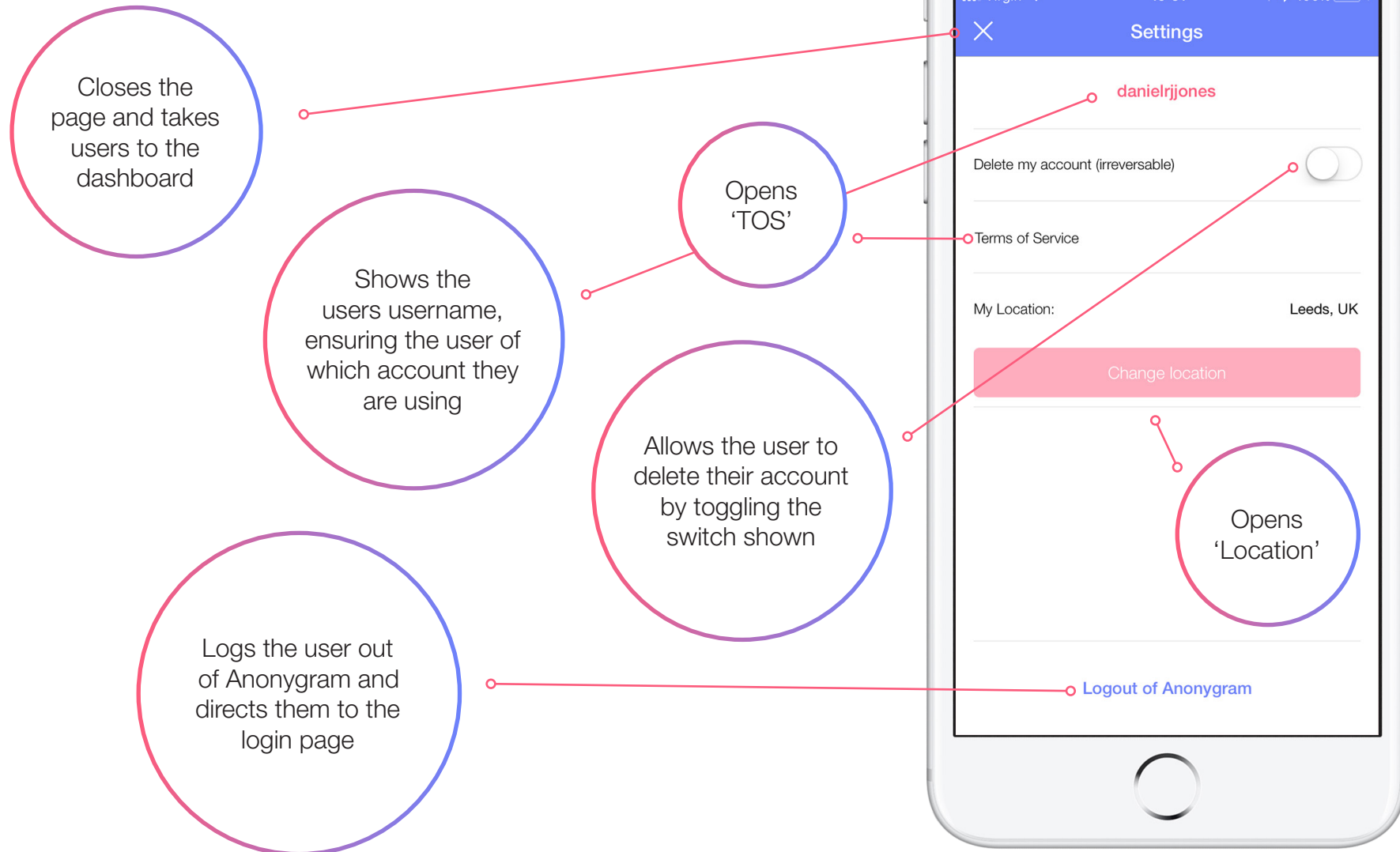

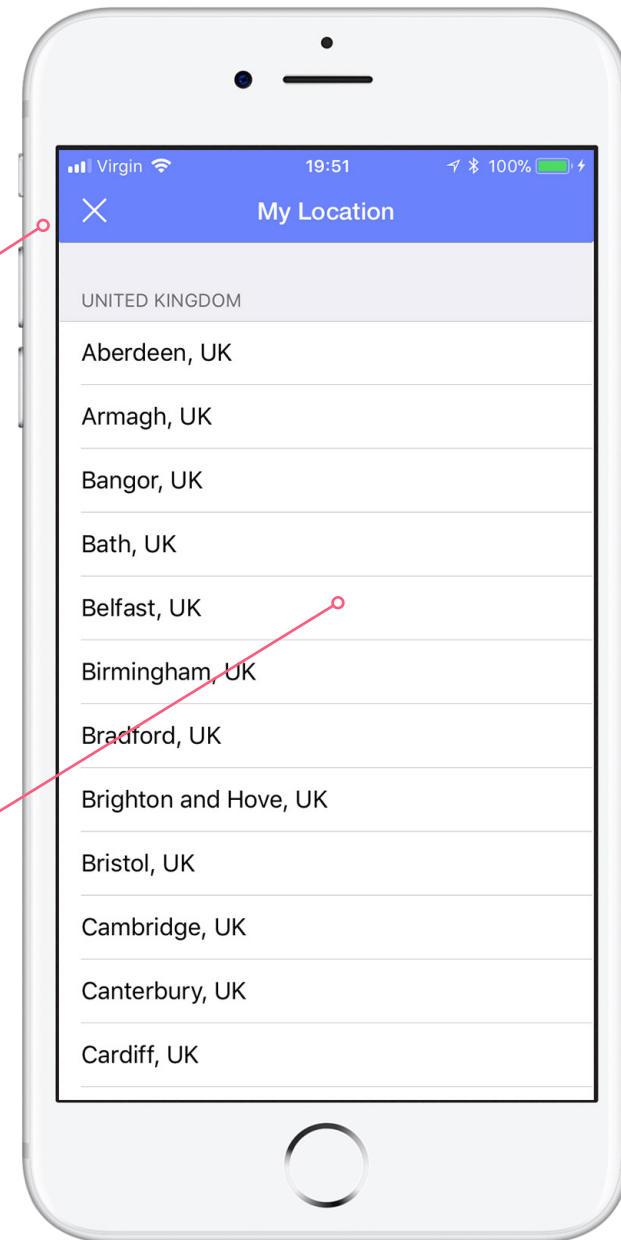

# Risks pt.1

Category	Risk	Severity	Problem	Solution
Design Risks	Design of the application may not appeal to all audiences.	Moderate	Because the target audience is everyone above the age of 13, it is important to make the app appealing to a wide range of audiences.	Have users test the product and ask for thorough feedback throughout the design process from all age ranges.
Design Risks	The application may not be suitable for all generations of iPhone.	High	Not all users are using the same device, some may have older versions and different sized screens and this could cause issues for each user differently.	Use constraints in XCode in order to make the designs work on all screen sizes. The app will also be deployed to iOS 9.0+ users to ensure it will be usable for newer devices.



# Risks pt.2

Category	Risk	Severity	Problem	Solution
Design Risks	The application may not be usable in landscape mode on the device.	High	Anonygram will only be designed for portrait use, meaning that it won't have a landscape view unlike some applications on the market.	Conduct research in order to see why the most popular social apps use only portrait modes and conduct testing from my audience to find out their opinion.
Technical Risks	Bugs within the code could cause issues for users.	High	Bugs can cause the app to crash for certain users (or all) and fail to load.	The application will be tested thoroughly on multiple devices. Firebase will also be used to track when the application has crashed and for which users.
Technical Risks	Mac could crash when developing the application.	High	If the computer crashes during development all work could possibly be lost.	Regularly take backups and use Github to store code used as an extra backup.

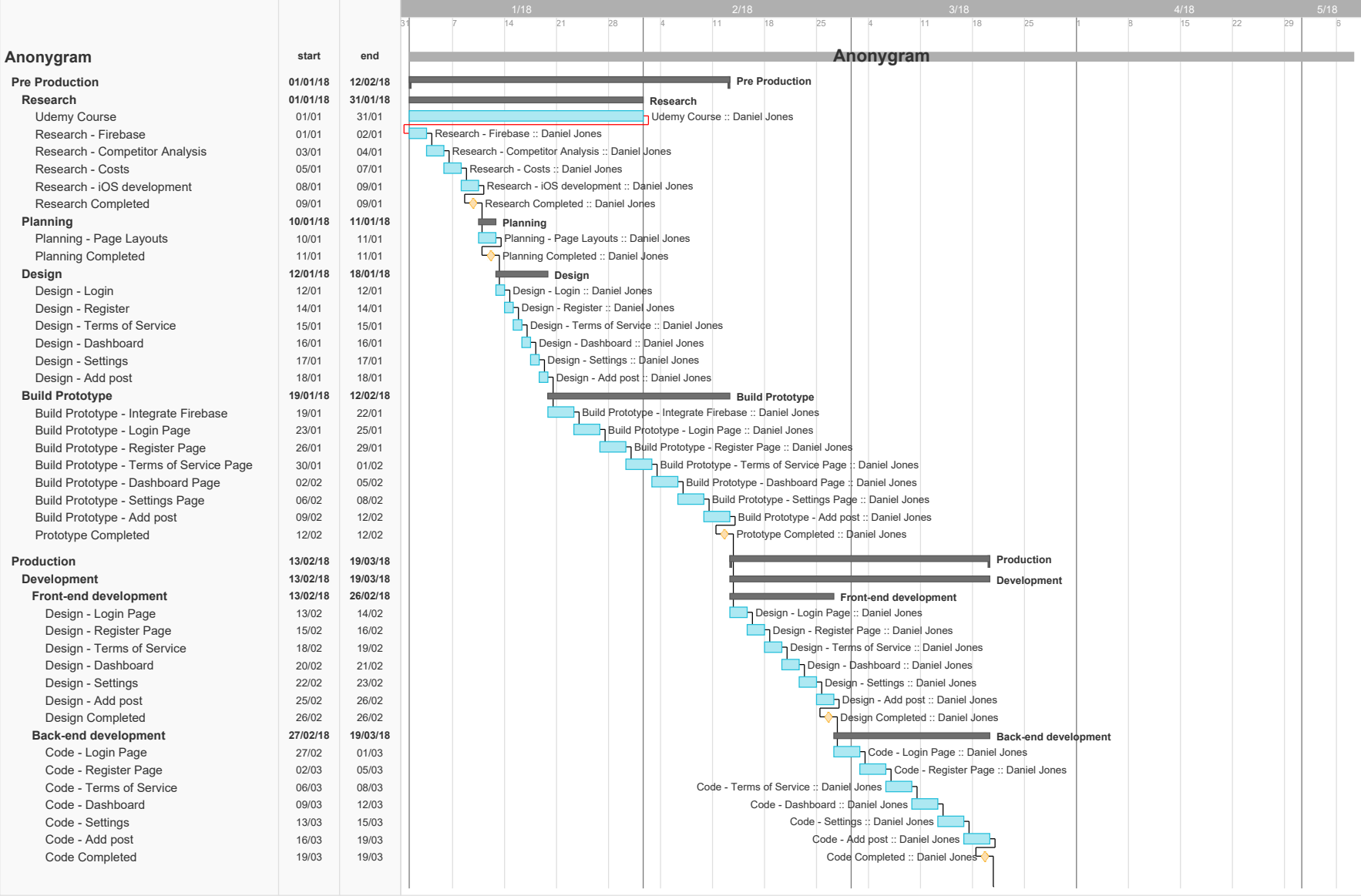
# Risks pt.3

Category	Risk	Severity	Problem	Solution
Technical Risks	Coding could break.	High	If the code breaks it will prevent the app from being built, causing problems for the developer.	Use Github for source control, see where the code was changed and when in order to find and fix the code quickly.
Project Management	Tasks could take longer than anticipated.	High	The app could take longer to develop than expected, causing delays in publishing.	Plan for extra time within the development period in case it is needed.
User Risks	Users may not have an email address.	Low	Users need an email address in order to sign up for the service.	Encourage users to create an email address using popular services.

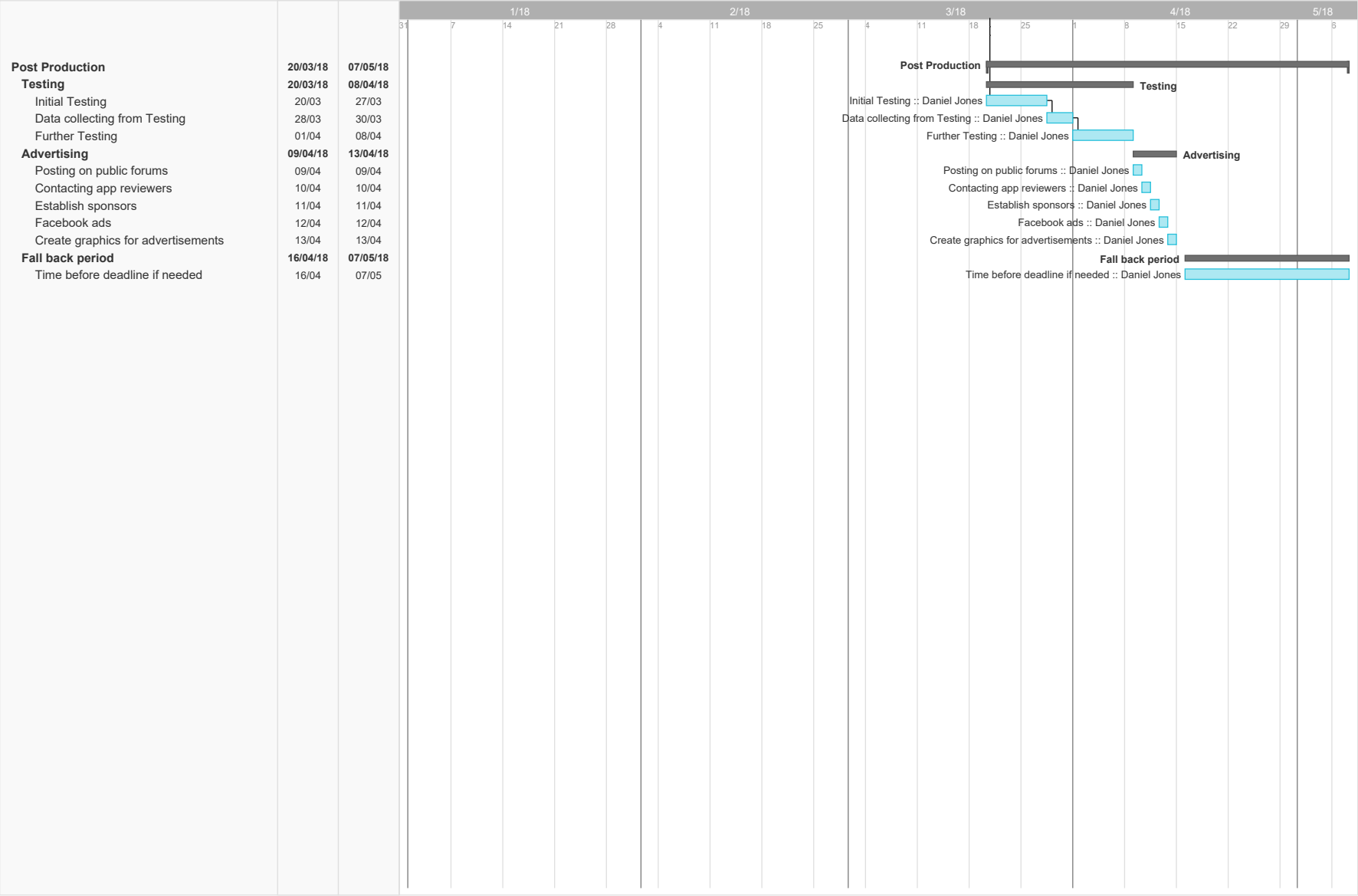
# Risks pt.4

Category	Risk	Severity	Problem	Solution
User Risks	Users may not trust the application with access to their camera and photo library.	Low	Anonygram uses the photo library in order to allow you to select images to upload.	Prompt the user with an alert that explains why the access is needed and give them the option to allow access or not.
User Risks	Users may use the platform in ways it wasn't intended for.	High	Users could use the platform to anonymously bully others or post images against the rules.	A voting system will be put in place in order to allow users to vote bad content out of the dashboard.
Research Risks	Research may show issues with any techniques or software that I have used.	Low	When creating the application, certain programs that I have used such as Firebase may not be capable of what it needs to be.	Research into other scalable database systems in case they are needed.
